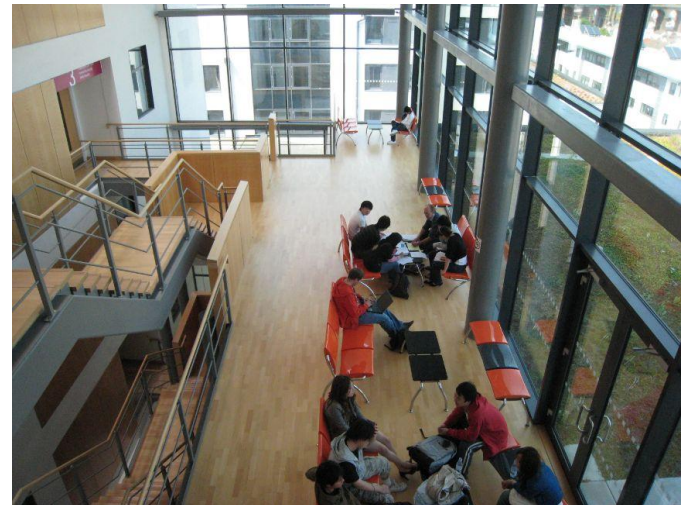

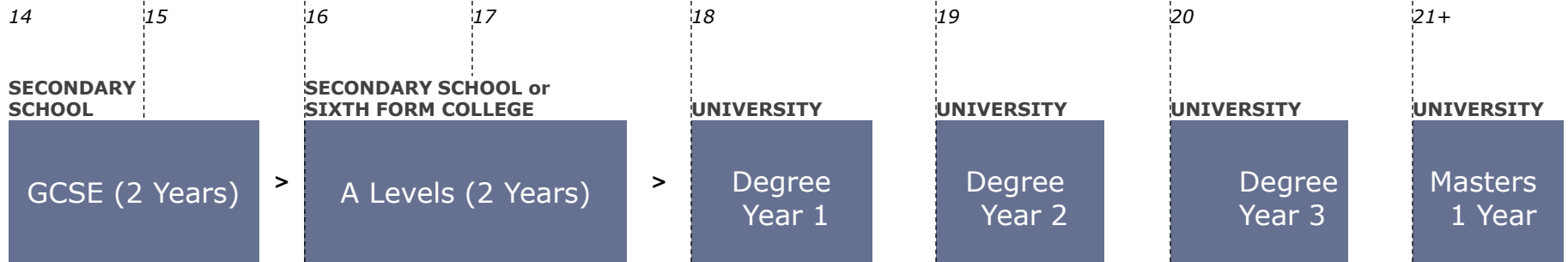

Typical student age

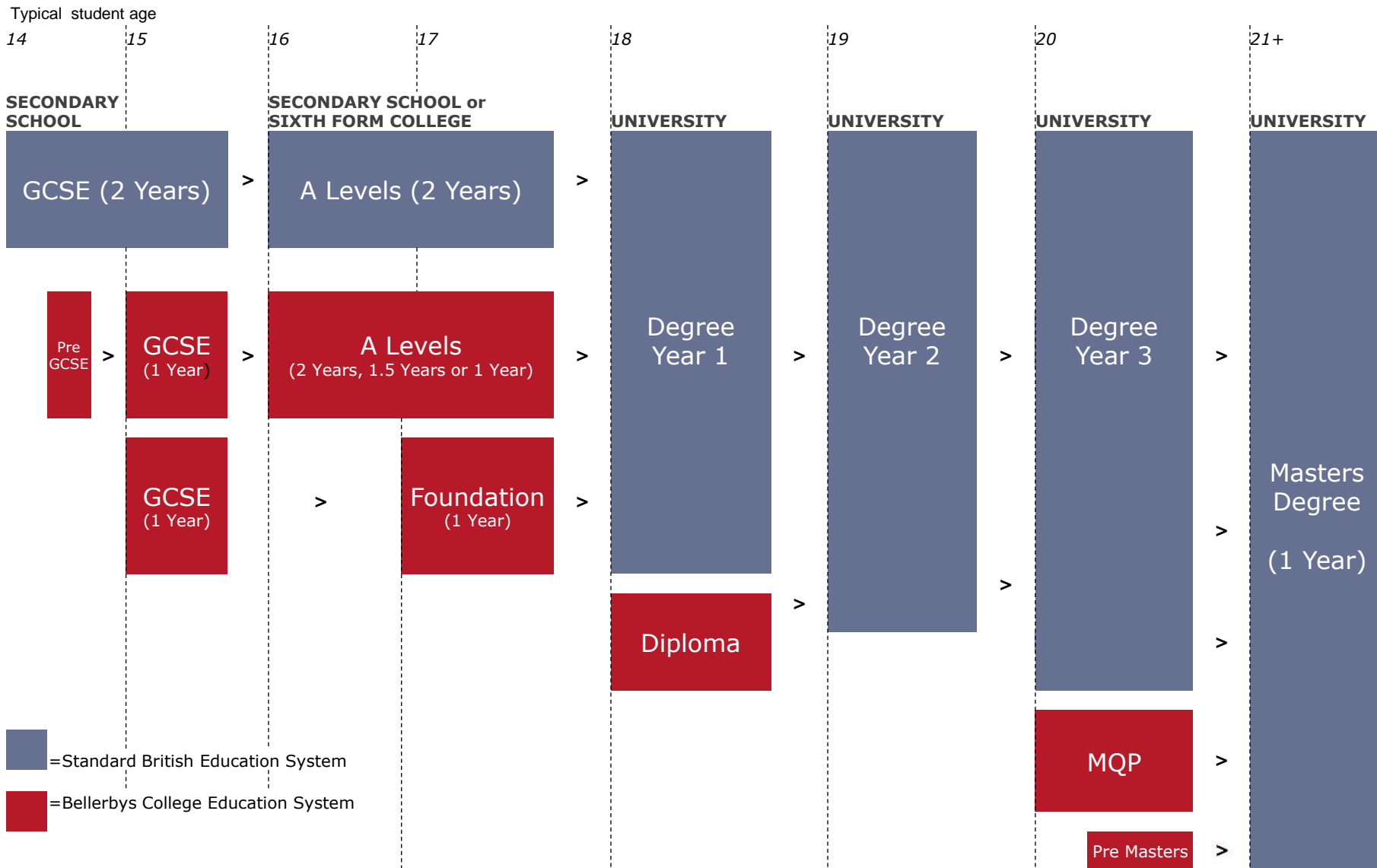


Notes:

## Routes into University for International Students:



### **A Levels: Unique UK High School Qualification**

- For students who have completed yr 11 (GCSE equiv.) or yr 10 (some countries)
- Students aiming for very top universities and medicine, dentistry;
- 100+ Universities in UK and recognized worldwide;
- 2 years or 1.5 years;

### **Bellerbys Foundation: Academically rigorous foundation course**

- For students who have completed yr 12 or yr 11 (GCSE equivalent)
- Guaranteed Entry to one of 50 partner universities;
- 9 months (one academic year);

### **Bellerbys Diploma: Enter 2nd year at university**

- For students who have A Levels or a Foundation, or completed high school from certain countries
- Entry to a range of universities
- 9 months (one academic year)

## UK High School, Year 10 and 11

Suitable for students who want to go abroad earlier and spend more time in the UK, leads into A Level or Foundation

### Entry requirements:

- Minimum age 14
- IELTS 4.5 or equivalent\*
- Completion of year 9 of education in home country
- Good school report from home country

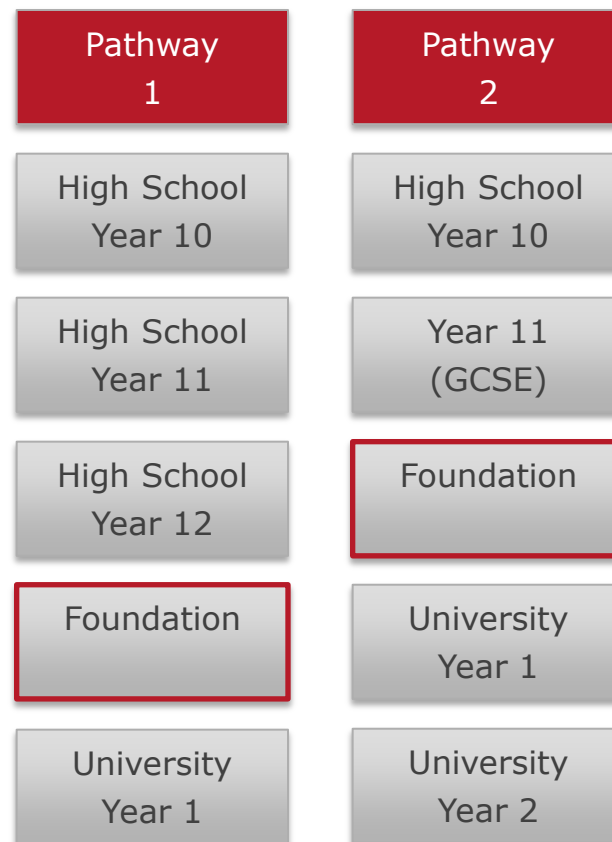

## Foundation Success Rate at Bellerbys



- In 2010:
  - 19 Students to Nottingham
  - 50 students to Manchester
  - 33 Students to Royal Holloway
  - 38 Students to City
  - 41 Students to Exeter
  - 40 Students to Bristol
- Students went to 72 different universities
- Students onto degree courses as varied as law, accounting, pharmacy, engineering, nutritional science, criminology, actuarial science
- Students also occasionally enter University College London, Warwick etc
- 1/3 of students entered top 20 ranked institutions
- Nearly 80% of graduates went to the top 50 Universities

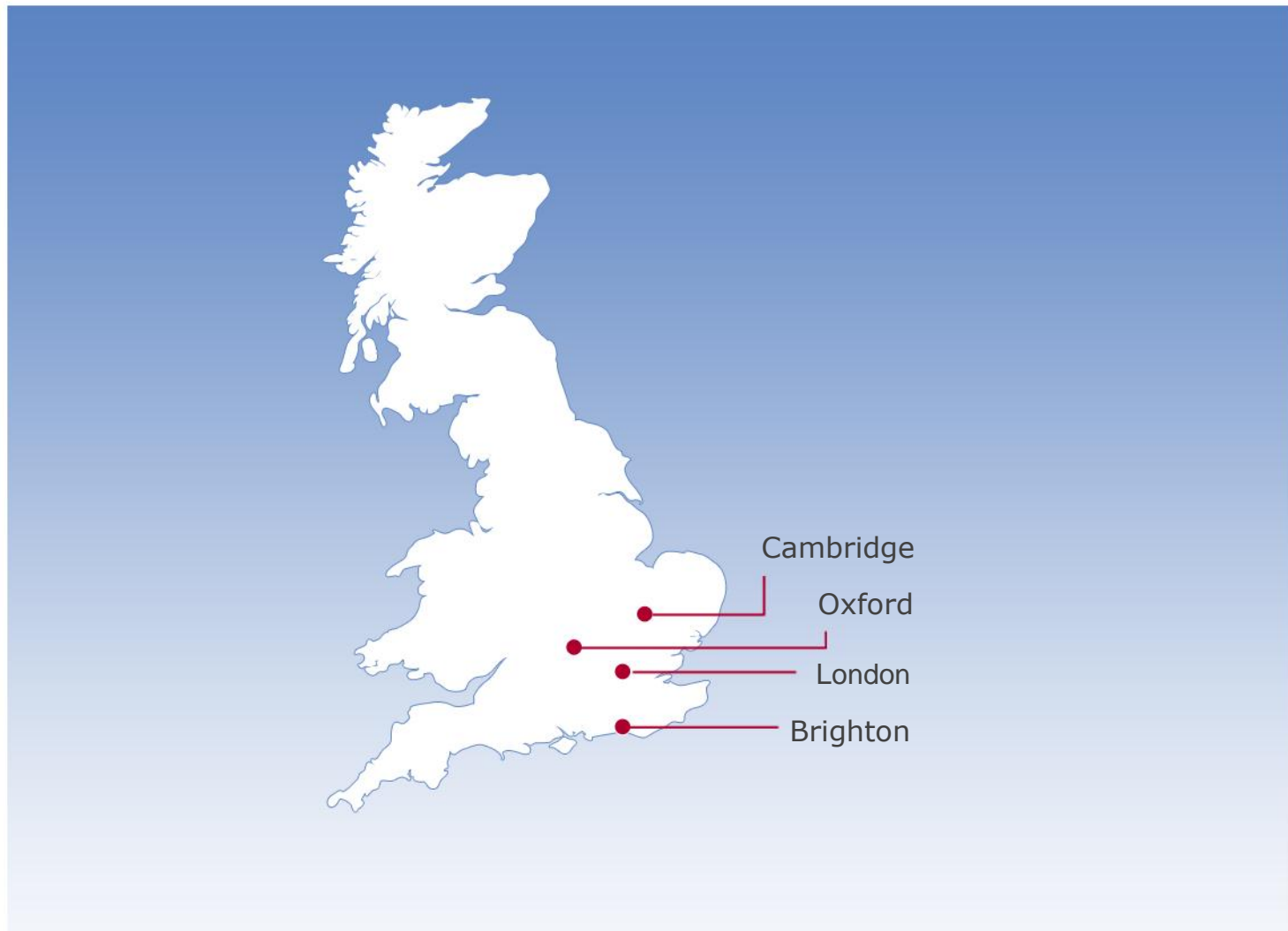

A HOST of schools have been named among the best performing in the country, according to exam results.

More than a dozen Sussex schools appear in this year's Good Schools Guide after their pupils scored the top national marks in subjects for this summer's A and AS-level exams.

Students taking maths A-level at Bellerbys College in

the New England Quarter, Brighton, scored the highest average score of any English independent school, while pupils at Christ's Hospital in Horsham were the leading Archaeology A-level students.

Boys at Chichester College were the best performing at any English comprehensive school in Russian A-level, while the school's girls

gained the top grades in Latin A-level.

The College of Richard Colyer in Horsham achieved multiple wins including best-performing girls at AS and A-level electronics and best boys for A-level home economics.

Girls at Roedean College in Brighton were the brightest linguists, taking top marks in AS-level Chinese, while

Lancing College girls received the best A-level exam results in the country in additional maths.

Other schools and colleges that achieved top scores in AS-levels, A-levels and BTECs included Hurstpierpoint College, BHASVIC and Central Sussex College.

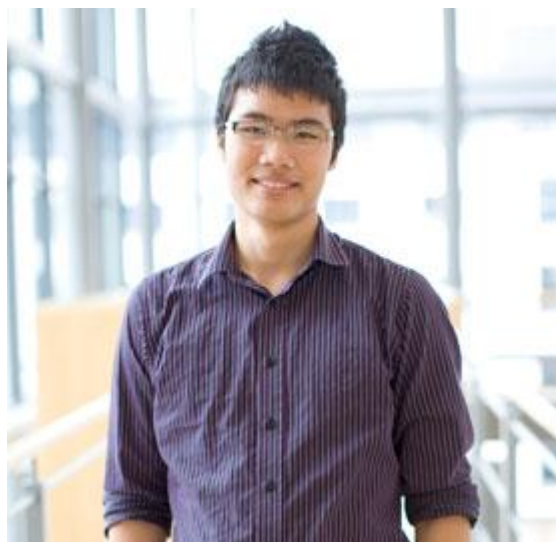

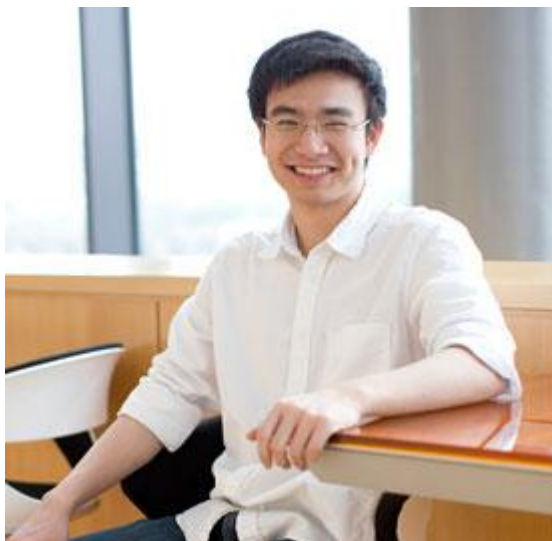
